



✕ Dubrovnik and its Golden Age, Walking Tour

Interests: history, architecture, culture

This tour is a real treat for visitors who want to see beyond the obvious and explore the architecture and history of Dubrovnik and the golden age of the Dubrovnik Republic. Your discovery begins as you enter the Old Town accompanied by your licensed guide through the Pile or Ploče Gate (two main entrances to the Old city). As you make your way through the pedestrian center and the famous Stradun street, you will visit the Church of Holy Salvation, a grandiose Franciscan and Dominican church, crown jewels of Dubrovnik, Knezev Dvor, the Rector's Palace, Old port, vibrant town squares, monuments, and fountains. One of the highlights of your walking tour is the famous Pharmacy located within the Franciscan Monastery, built in 1317. Inside is a fascinating collection of decorated jars filled with ancient remedies; unique measurement devices, together with alembics and mortars. The Monastery, which also houses a museum with an excellent art collection, took a century to build and was almost destroyed in the tragic earthquake of 1667. City walls around the Old city are an entirely private part of the tour - guides do not go up, but if you wish to embark on an exploration of the monumental walls it is definitely a worthwhile experience and a pleasant 2-hour walk. Water and SPF are recommended, especially during the summer months.

✕ **Game of Thrones in Dubrovnik and Red Keep Discovery Tour**

Interests: architecture, culture, nature

With your professional guide, explore the unique locations in Dubrovnik and its surroundings used as set locations for Game of Thrones. First discover the locations of some of the most iconic GOT scenes in the old town, including; The Pile Gate, Lovrijenac, also known as the Red Keep, fortified walls of King's Landing, Gradac park -the Purple wedding setting, Belvedere atrium - trial by combat scene, the Jesuit steps – location of the Walk of Shame, Bokar and Minčeta forts – the House of the Undying. You will then continue to Trsteno, a quaint seaside town on the outskirts of Dubrovnik, famous for its postcard-worthy Arboretum. Spanning over 70 acres with over 450 species of plant life, the Trsteno Arboretum is the oldest and biggest monument of garden architecture in Croatia. Because of its seaside location and natural beauty, Trsteno was selected as the perfect setting for the Tyrell high garden. After the tour of the grounds, your driver will transfer you back to the hotel.

✕ **Foodie and Wine Walking Tour**

Interests: architecture, culture, gastronomy

Embark on a tour that will let you see beyond the renowned sites of Dubrovnik and explore the architecture, history, and lifestyle of this famous city. Your discovery begins as you enter the Old Town accompanied by our guide through the Pile Gate. Walk to the local shop for the presentation of traditional sweets. Through the tasting, you will get to know the history of the city and local products that have shaped the cuisine of Dubrovnik and its surrounding areas through the ages. Enhance your experience with a tasting of freshly baked bread drizzled with local olive oils that contain the best combination of herbs and garlic. If you prefer something sweeter, you will be able to try the traditional dry fig and almond salami, fig jams, candied almonds, and arancini followed by an espresso and freshly made carob muffins served on the steps of the Old town. After your batteries are recharged, you will walk to St. Savior's, a grandiose Franciscan and Dominican church, and the crown jewels of Dubrovnik, Knezev Dvor, the Rector's Palace Old port, squares, monuments, fountains, etc. One of the real highlights of your walking tour will be the famous Pharmacy at the Franciscan Monastery, built-in 1317. After the tour of the old town, you can continue your exploration with a walk along the walls on your own, or you can continue sampling finger foods or wines from local producers.

✕ **Pelješac Wine Tasting Tour**

Interests: gastronomy, nature, culture

Peljesac Wine Tour takes you to the beautiful Pelješac peninsula, home to some of the most intriguing red wines. The tour includes a trio of wine-tasting opportunities in some of Croatia's most respected wine cellars and field visits to their vineyards on the picturesque slopes of this magnificent peninsula. Your first wine tasting experience will be in the Matusko winery, where you will get a chance to taste red & white wines and their legendary Dingac, made from 100% Plavac Mali grapes. Next, you will visit the Grgic winery in Trstenik. Miljenko Grgich studied wine-making in Zagreb. After migrating to the US, with only \$20 in his pocket, he founded now world-famous Grgich Hills winery in Napa Valley. While you visit the Grgic cellars, you will taste their famous white Posip and red Plavac Mali Dingac. The last winery is Madirazza, which made a name for itself with its stunning vineyards and excellent wines.

✕ **Ston Oyster Tasting**

Interests: gastronomy, culture, off-the-beaten path

In the times of the Dubrovnik Republic, Ston was the second most important town after Dubrovnik itself. Its wealth was derived from salt production, and the traditional production remains intact to this day. Although this charming medieval town is renowned for the spectacular city walls that are considered to be the second-longest in the world, this region is also known as the Oysters capital of Croatia thanks to the distinctive blend of nutrients in the local waters. After a walk along the famous wall, you will head towards the oyster farm and join your hosts for a scenic boat ride among the oyster beds to find out how oysters are cultivated. You will have a unique opportunity to pick your oysters and taste them on the spot. After learning about the meticulous oyster farming process, you will return to shore and indulge in the oysters you picked along with local mussels, Croatian wine, and homemade rakija (a traditional fruit brandy) in a peaceful garden overlooking the sea.

✕ **Traditional Silk Production in Cavtat and Konavle**

Interests: history, culture, exclusive & unique

A few minutes south of Dubrovnik is the ancient Roman settlement of Cavtat and the Konavle valley-the very southernmost part of Croatia. After visiting Cavtat, we continue into the beautiful interior of the area known as the Konavle. Our tour will continue in one of the hidden villages where we will have the chance to get a unique opportunity to see how the story of Silk starts. Sericulture in Konavle, a centuries-old craft, one of the most important and almost forgotten aspects of tradition and cultural heritage of this region... We invite you to visit and take part in this ancient craft of producing the silk threads in the most traditional manner... From a cocoon to silk.... Konavle - the cradle of sericulture. Sericulture – identity and cultural heritage of Konavle.

✕ **Konavle Cycling Tour with Wine Tasting**

Interests: nature, gastronomy, outdoor activity

Move away from the hustle and bustle of Dubrovnik and spend the day cycling in the verdant hinterland. After meeting your driver at the hotel, you will arrive at the village of Gruda in Konavle. You will be greeted by your cycling guide and fitted for your bike and equipment. You will then cycle through the small village roads that run across the active Konavle region. The trail will lead you through orchards, cornfields, vineyards, blueberry fields, and along the way you will cross the bridges of Ljuta and Konavočica rivers. Throughout your day, you will take short breaks for refreshments and get acquainted with the historical and natural characteristics of the Konavle region. You will have the opportunity to visit the Franciscan monastery, an old mill in Ljuta village, and the charming waterfalls of Ljuta river. Taking small village roads, you will return to Gruda and the Dubrovnik wine cellars, where you will be able to taste and buy famous wines produced from local grapes.

✕ **Korcula Island and Matsuko Winery Tour**

Interests: architecture, history, culture

Korcula is one of the most beautiful islands on Croatia's Adriatic coast with a historic walled town, great beaches, and locally produced food and wine. Your tour to Korcula will start with a drive through the beautiful wine region of the Peljesac peninsula to the seaside town of Orebic, where will leave the driver behind and take a short 20-minute ferry ride to the Island of Korcula. Once there, you will have a few hours to explore the museums, historic sites, and small cobbled streets of Korcula's Old Town, the birthplace of the great explorer Marco Polo. You will also have time for lunch. In the late afternoon, you will board the ferry for Orebic, where the driver will be waiting to take you back to Dubrovnik. On the way back to Dubrovnik, you'll stop for wine tasting at the renowned Matusko winery in Potomlje.



✕ **Dubrovnik Sunset Sailing Experience**

During the tour, you will make numerous stops including several stops near the “mythical” Island of Lokrum and on the island itself where you will break for a refreshing snack at the Lacroma snack bar. You will then continue your kayaking adventure with more sunbathing and snorkeling opportunities before returning to Dubrovnik.

✕ Mljet Island Cruise

Escape the bustling city of Dubrovnik on a private boat and head for a pristine island oasis of the National Park Mljet. During the 60-minute speedboat ride, you will enjoy the breathtaking views of the Elaphiti islands. Mljet is a forest-shrouded slice of heaven and one of the most seductive of all the Adriatic islands. Even though the establishment of a national park back in 1960 put the island on the tourist map, it is still one of Croatia's best-kept secrets, filled with secluded beaches, verdant bays, and unspoiled air of tranquility that, according to legend, captivated Odysseus for seven years while he was under Calypso's spell. Explore the island, its two inland lakes, and miles of cycling and strolling trails, or just pick your favorite beach and relax under the Mediterranean sun.

✕ Hvar and Blue Cave Boat Tour

Discover some of the most pristine waters in Central Dalmatia and explore hidden bays and natural wonders during this exciting boat tour. After meeting your driver at the hotel, you will be transferred to the city port and board the private boat. Your skipper will go over the daily itinerary which will depend on the sea conditions on the day, and start your journey to the Blue Cave. Once in front of the cave, you will transfer into a smaller boat and enter this amazing natural phenomenon. Between 11 am and 1 pm on a sunny calm day, sun rays passing through an underwater opening illuminate the cave turning it bright blue light while objects beneath the surface shimmer in silver and pink. After you exit the cave and return to your boat, the skipper will set course for Pakleni islands, an archipelago of untouched islands and islets with numerous swim stops and great restaurants where you can enjoy the freshest seafood should you decide to stop here for an optional lunch or lounge bars if you just want to relax in the sun. You will then head to island Hvar where the skipper will help you disembark and assist with luggage as you make your way to your hotel.
